WorkWell pilot programme supports over 400 people in first 3 months

Since launching in November 2024, the free and voluntary WorkWell programme has helped over 400 people across Cambridgeshire, with 39% facing health-related barriers that impact their ability to work. The programme provides confidential support to employees, helping them manage health conditions, remain in work, or return after sickness absence. Participants work with a dedicated Work and Health Coach to develop a personalised action plan, signposting them to local support services.

Businesses that engage with WorkWell create healthier, more productive teams, reducing staff turnover, improving morale, and boosting efficiency. The service complements, rather than replaces, existing HR, occupational health, or workplace wellbeing initiatives.

Employees from a variety of sectors have accessed WorkWell, highlighting the widespread impact of health-related work challenges. The top four sectors include health and social work (17%), retail and motor trade (11%), education (9%), and business support (7%).

Skills Bootcamps

Skills Bootcamps are a great way to upskill your workforce, supporting growth, better productivity and staff retention.

SMEs can get funding for 90% of the cost of Skills Bootcamps per employee, while larger employers can access funding of 70% per employee. There are also opportunities for employers to design and shape the skills being delivered, with bespoke training designed to fit the needs of your organisation. Alternatively, you can fill gaps in your workforce by offering an interview to an individual who is undertaking a Skills Bootcamp, bringing new talent into your organisation.

There are hundreds of courses in a range of sectors, including:

- Digital skills, such as digital marketing, software development, data engineering and coding
- Technical skills, such as construction, logistics (HGV driving), engineering and manufacturing
- Skills that support the green economy, such as electric vehicles, heat pump technology, solar energy and agriculture technology.
